### where we meet

- Monthly guild meetings are held on the first Wednesday of each month at the Second Congregational Church on Hillside Street, Bennington, VT. The meeting and monthly featured program begins at 6:30 pm, although members assemble around 6:00 pm in a more social mode. Guests and friends are always welcome!
- Smaller focus groups meet through out the month—for example we have regular hand quilting sessions, a Dear Jane group, the Canfield Library small quilting group and one that makes our Raffle quilt.







Workshops are terrific fun and are held monthly, usually on a Saturday, at our same location and range from beginner to advanced projects, some with a featured instructor and some taught by members in the guild. Lots of sharing and laughter. We also gather in workshops to quilt for charity.



## Community Service Programs



The Guild members are highly motivated to be of service to the community providing quilted items for those in need. The premier service project for QVQ is the "Quilt Cupboard," where members make quilts that are then donated to families who need quilts for physical and psychological warmth. We also partner with the Southern Vermont Medical Cancer Center to provide quilts for transitioning cancer patients and several other charities.

For the last 26 years, we have hosted an annual quilt show. The Bennington QuiltFest has grown into one of the area's most popular events every year.
